







Thousands of testimonials about the June 14th, 1941

- Personal documents
- Diaries and letters
- Photographs (taken from Latvia and made in forced settlement)
- Items that were taken along with
- Items that were got/earned/gifted during the time in forced settlement
- Pieces of Art where experience transforms into a creative expression

- **2419** video testimonies (4475 h)
- **240** deportees of 14th June 1941
- Eye-witness memories of 14th June 1941

#### Deportees of 14th June 1941

(1,55% from all deportees on 14th June 1941 \*)

- 38 adult\*\* of 1941 interviews. (The oldest deported person that the Museum has interviewed, was 40 years old on the deportation day (Edīte Kubuliņa, Inv.nr. OMF2300/218))
- 3 adult men one survived 'Vyatlag', two weren't separated from their families
- 198 interviewees were deported to Krasnoyarsk region, 41 Novosibirsk oblast
- 229 Latvians, 7 Jews, 1 Russian, 1 Pole, 1 Lithuanian from Kaunas, 1 Estonian from Pärnu.
- 4 later arrested, sentenced and imprisoned in GULAG
- 132 returned to Latvia soon after WWII 1945. 1948. 62 from them were deported back to forced settlement.
- 143 returned to Latvia soon after release from forced settlement 1954 to 1960, 14 from 1960 to 1993, 13 didn't return
- 15 interviews are in Russian, others in Latvian

\* **15 424** Latvian people were deported
